Scholarship information

- The scholarship covers most expenses including: application fee, program and housing fees, J-1 SEVIS visa fee, health insurance, and an airfare allowance (Total scholarship value: above \$13,000 USD)
- This program is available to students (undergraduate and graduate) enrolled in higher education institutions located in these six countries that are affiliated with TWC.

Program Components

This program provides students interested in learning more about the financial role of the private, government, and nonprofit sectors in the U.S. and around the world an opportunity to intern and interact with experts in areas such as business, corporate social responsibility and ethics, and the intersections of business and government. The program has the following components:

- Internship: you will be placed in an internship with an organization that fits your interests and skills. You will intern four days a week.
- Academic Course: you will complete an academic course. TWC's faculty includes adjunct professors from local universities including Georgetown and Johns Hopkins University, among others.
- Leadership Forum: you will attend a series of events with experts and leaders from the private, public, and nonprofit sectors on Monday afternoons.
- **Civic Engagement/Social Responsibility Project:** you will devote a minimum of 15 hours over the semester to active learning and action to become well-informed about an issue you care about and then work to make a positive difference in public life at the local, national or global level.
- **Portfolio:** you will produce a compilation of documents that chronicles and summarizes your learning experience during your time with The Washington Center.

Program Dates

The Fall 2015 Program begins on August 26, 2015 and ends on December 12, 2015.

** Due to increasing competitiveness of the program, only highly qualified applicants will be contacted for an interview. In order to move forward in the selection process, applicants that successfully pass the interview will be asked to complete the comprehensive Washington Center online application that includes the following documents: resume, copy of official transcript, 500 word writing sample, two letters of recommendation, copy of passport, and copy of official English Competency test (unless waived).
