SPSF

The SPSP program is implemented in six departments: Journalism, Education, Sociology, Economics, Management, and Global Studies.

It offers discipline-based courses where students can enhance their knowledge in their respective fields of study as well as interdisciplinary courses offered with the cooperation of other departments. This approach aims to establish curricula to work on finding solutions to sustainability-related issues and foster students' abilities to overcome them.

FLA

The mission of the Faculty of Liberal Arts (FLA) is to prepare students of diverse backgrounds to take the lead in bridging differences and promoting understanding in the complex world of the twenty-first century. After learning how to perform at a high academic level through the Core Program courses, the students then choose one of the three offered majors (Comparative Culture; International Business and Economics; Social Studies) at the end of their third semester. The faculty's broad interdisciplinary curriculum allows students to expand their general knowledge, develop critical thinking, and to nurture a broad, humanistic mind-set.

FST

The Green Science program, offered by the Department of Materials and Life Sciences, is designed to train the students on the fundamentals of chemistry, physics, and biology and to apply this knowledge to overcome environmental issues. The Green Engineering program, offered by the Department of Engineering and Applied Sciences, is designed for students to learn the fundamentals of physics, mechanical engineering, and electrical/electronics engineering and to help them develop a comprehensive ability of engineering for environmental issues.

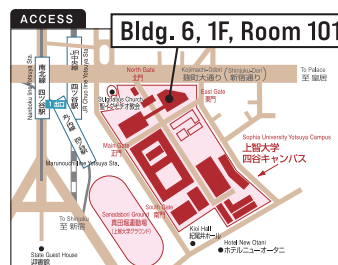
